## **Burghley House Victorian Trip-Friday 8th December 2023**

As part of our Victorian topic this term, Norwich class will be visiting the Burghley House near Grantham to experience part of life in the Victorian times. There is **no** souvenir shop at the workhouse so children will not require any spending money.

The visit will take place on **Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December.** The coach will depart promptly from school at 9.00 a.m. and we will not arrive back at school until approximately 3.30 p.m. Please make sure your child is at school for 8.50 a.m. as the departure time cannot be delayed. The children will require a packed lunch on this day.

The cost of this trip is £18.00 per child, which includes, entrance to the house; three fantastic workshops led by staff on-site; and the cost of transport. A donation has been made towards the trip from the PTFA, and school has also subsidised the trip to help keep costs to a minimum. We would like to thank them for their support towards the varied educational experiences of children at St. Andrew's Leasingham.

Please note that whilst no child will be excluded through non-payment of the voluntary contribution, please understand that the trip may not go ahead if insufficient funding is received. Payment should be made via WISEPAY.
