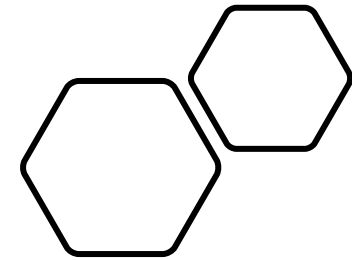

# Routines

- PE this half term (unless you are informed otherwise) will be Thursday and Friday. Please come in PE kit.

- Water bottle – labelled and with a closed lid please.
- Coats – please check the weather, children will need coats to go outside.

# Reading

- Reading to adults will mainly take place as whole class reading.
- Little Wandle readers – please bring books in every Monday to be changed.
- Big Cat readers - these books to be changed whenever they have been finished and placed in the book box for changing in school (children will need to remember to do this). We will then change the book as soon as possible. Book needs to be kept for at least 2 nights.
- Please aim to read at least 3 times a week.

# Nut Free School
