Winchester Update (Year 2)



It has been a very busy term for us in Year 2!

We started the term by visiting Sleaford Islamic Centre, to consolidate our learning about the religion of Islam. The Imam and our hosts were very welcoming and asked us if we wanted to wear head scarfs or caps for our time in the Mosque. They talked to us about the Five Pillars of Islam, gave us a guided tour of the Mosque, taught us about the Arabic alphabet and shared dates with us, as many Muslims eat these to break their fast during the month of Ramadan.





In our history lessons, we have learnt about the Great Fire of London. We learnt how, where and why it started, and the changes made to house building after the fire. We also wrote a diary entry in English as if we were there at the time of the fire. Linked to this, we are currently putting the finishing touches to our Tudor Houses as part of our Design Technology project and are very excited for Year 2 parents to see the finished pieces at the end of term.

Our artwork this term has focussed on collage. We have been inspired by scenes from the Great Fire of London, but also Eric Carle's book 'The Tiny Seed' which linked to our science unit on plants. We used this book to create a mixed media collage, using a variety of techniques, including paint splatting and rolling. We are very proud of the finished pieces and hope you'll agree that they are very effective.
