Southwell Update (Year 6)



In History, Year 6 recently embarked on a journey back in time to Ancient Egypt, bringing the rich history and culture of this ancient civilisation to life. We had a fantastic experience day which was brimming with a variety of engaging activities that gave the wonders of this fascinating civilisation. One of the highlights of the day was the exploration of hieroglyphics, the ancient Egyptian writing system composed of intricate symbols and characters. The children had the opportunity to decode and write their own messages using these symbols. We also had the opportunity to look at mummification, artifacts, daily life as well as playing two Egyptian games. The day was a great success providing a unique opportunity for these young minds to delve into history and culture, igniting their curiosity about the world's fascinating past.



In Science, the children developed their conceptual understanding of the circulatory system by dissecting a pigs heart. The children were a huge support to each other and everyone had a role to play. At first, they identified the superior vena cava, aorta, pulmonary veins and arteries. We then opened it up to see into the chambers of the heart. They particularly enjoyed tugging on the heart strings. Pigs hearts are similar in size to human hearts which gave the children a real life comparison. The children were fascinated by the experience and inspired (future heart surgeons). It was a wonderful experience and true hands on learning.



Norwich Update (Year 5)



On Tuesday 30th September, Year 5 (and 6) pupils were given an incredible opportunity to step into the shoes of forensic scientists during an exciting, hands-on workshop run by Pulse Education Forensics. The day was packed full of fun, fascinating activities that captured the children's imaginations and challenged them to think like real investigators.

The morning began by exploring an important Computer Forensics and Online Safety session, where pupils learned age-appropriate advice for staying safe on social media and how to make responsible choices online.

Next the children learned real forensic techniques, such as:

- Taking fingerprints, exploring DNA and genetic identity
- Examining trace evidence like hair and fibres under a microscope
- Using UV light to search for clues at a crime scene and uncovering and analysing footwear evidence.

It was wonderful to see so many children completely engaged — eyes wide with curiosity, asking thoughtful questions, and handling equipment with growing confidence!

Finally, in the afternoon, it was time to put their skills to the test in a mock crime scene investigation. Working together in teams, the pupils:

- Collected and analysed fingerprints
- Searched for clues
- Pieced together evidence
- And ultimately solved the mystery by identifying the main suspect!

Throughout the investigation, the children demonstrated brilliant teamwork, problem-solving, and communication skills — all while having enormous fun. It was a truly memorable experience that brought science and learning to life in such a unique and inspiring way. We are so proud of how Year 5 and 6 embraced the challenge — we may have some future forensic scientists in our midst!


