

Foundation Stage Curriculum Outline

'Animal Planet!' Spring Term (1) 2023

Communication & Language/Literacy (CLL)



As part of our 'Animal Planet!' topic, we will be reading a selection of stories and non-fiction texts based around a wide range of different animals. In phonics, we will be focusing on blending and segmenting words orally, and in writing, as well as learning new digraphs and trigraphs. We will also be thinking about our handwriting and how to form letters correctly. We will have many opportunities to talk and express ourselves verbally, thinking about speaking clearly and using the new vocabulary that we have learned from the texts that we have shared together. We will also work on following more complex instructions carefully.

Mathematics

In Mathematics we will be developing our skills when counting objects accurately and recognising the numbers up to 10, including zero. We will continue to explore basic addition and subtraction, thinking about how to record our calculations using mathematical symbols. There will be a focus on number bonds to 5, and then 10 as well as forming our numbers correctly. We will also think about 2D and 3D shapes, mass and capacity.



Understanding the World (UW)

We will be looking closely at the different places in the world where the animals that we learn about live and finding them on a map. We will have opportunities to program the BeeBots to follow a route that we have planned as well as thinking about our own route to school. There will be a focus on Chinese New Year (with some food tasting!) as well as a chance to observe some of the seasonal changes occurring around us. We will also think about the days of the week and months of the year.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED/Jigsaw)

This term we will be focusing on the theme of 'Dreams and Goals' We will be thinking about what keeps us motivated and the importance of a positive attitude when something presents us with a challenge. Our own dreams and goals will be an important part of our circle times as we think about what we would like to achieve this year.

Physical Development and P.E

P.E will now be taught on a **Friday** morning. This half term, the children will be working on ball skills and games. Our P.E. sessions will take place indoors in the hall. There will also be a range of activities on offer each day to develop gross motor skills (e.g. large building blocks, obstacle courses) and fine motor skills (e.g. cutting, Lego).

Religious Education (R.E.)

In R.E. we will learn about 'Our Special Books', thinking about what we like to read at home as well as special books linked to different religions. We will hopefully manage a visit to our local church to see what it is like, and which special books are contained within it. We will develop the use of our classroom reflection area and begin to write our own prayers. There will be opportunities for Collective Worship in the school hall led by a range of adults and visitors.



Expressive Arts & Design (EAD)



There will be many opportunities for painting, drawing, model making and role-play throughout this term! We will be creating posters, collages, models and paintings. Our role play area will be a vet's surgery where we can care for the different animals that we have learned about. Each week we will take part in a music lesson where we will explore our voices and play a selection of musical instruments.

We will continue to send home reading books and phonics activities for you to share with your child. Please spend a few moments each day looking at them. Little and often makes all of the difference to your child's learning! New reading books will be sent home each Monday. Please don't forget to record the reading in the reading diary so that we know books need changing. Thank you for your help and support during Term Two. This term is always busy and filled with learning, a time when we really start to see progress with reading and writing! We cannot wait to see what 2023 will bring...
