

CURRICULUM OUTLINE – Our Wonderful World

Lincoln: Year 1 Summer Term

English

To celebrate the Queen's Jubilee, our first English topic will centre around the book 'The Queen's Hat'. We will study the book before writing our own stories. Linking to our topic of 'Our Wonderful World' we will be exploring the non-fiction genres of information texts and journals. We will use research skills to create our own non-fiction texts.

Maths

- Numbers to 40
- Addition and Subtraction to 40
- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions
- Numbers to 100
- Time
- Money
- Volume and Capacity
- Mass and Space



The children will be following the scheme of Maths No Problem.

Science



In Science this term, the children will be finding out about what plants need to grow well. We will also be learning about different flowers and trees. In class we will be planting seeds, bulbs and cress and then carrying out comparison tests to identify the best growing conditions.

After half term, the children will look at life processes and the needs of humans and other living things in order to stay alive and healthy. They will also study different habitats and how living things depend on each other.

Geography



Our Geography learning will run alongside our Science topic. Whilst finding out about habitats, we will consider where habitats are located, naming towns, countries and continents. We will also consider the features of areas such as coasts, oceans, mountains and forests. Finally, we will combine our scientific and geographical knowledge to discuss areas around our world and how they have been improved or spoilt and

the reasons why.

Computing

ICT will be used to support learning across all areas of the curriculum. The school continues to follow the scheme from Purple Mash. In the first half term, we will complete the unit 'Maze Explorers', a coding unit with a focus on using directions. We will then move onto 'Tech Outside School', a unit designed to support children's knowledge on how technology is used across our lives. Finally, we will complete 'Animated Stories' with a focus on word processing.



Art & Design Technology



In Art this term the children will be creating art in response to Eric Carle. They will also be creating moods in art work and think about how the mood of art shows how people feel. The children will use pencils of different thickness to do their own topic-related sketches. In Design and Technology the children will practise skills needed for cooking as well as designing their own healthy dips and dippers before evaluating them.

Music



This term the children will explore the Charanga Units of 'Round and Round' and 'Your Imagination'. During these units, the children will learn how to appraise music, considering what they like and dislike. They will go on to create their own with the use of some instruments.

Physical Education (PE)

During the term, the children will be developing their team working skills by focusing on small sided games. As the weather improves, the children will be working on their athletics skills. PE this term will be on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather and ensure they have a sun hat and water bottle in school.



Religious Education (RE)



This term we will be following the Lincolnshire Agreed Syllabus which focusses on 'Places of Worship'. We will consider the significance of the places of worship of Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism and Judaism and will explore the key symbols within each religion.

Personal Social & Health Education (PSHE)

The themes this term for Jigsaw are 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me'. The children will be exploring feelings within the context of our important relationships including family and friends. In addition, the children will develop their ability to understand and manage the feelings associated with change. This will support the children with their transition to a new class in September. Finally, we will talk about bodies and discuss how we have changed since we were babies and the differences between boys and girls.



French



During the term, the children will be following the Language Angels scheme which provides them with a linguistically rich and emotionally significant opportunity to speak a new language.
