Dear Parents/Carers,

It is hard to believe that we are now entering the last few days of this term, after what has been a very busy academic year. It goes without saying that we will need to make some adjustments as a school to accommodate this work, but we are very much looking forward to a brand new classroom for us to be able to use in 2025.

Summer Reading Challenge

We were delighted to welcome a representative from Sleaford Library into school last week, to tell us all about the Summer Reading Challenge. This was launched last weekend and will run through until mid-September. Children can sign up for the challenge now to receive their core pack in which they can collect stickers and prizes over the summer holidays for reading at least six library books. Children must be registered for a library card before they begin the challenge. Finishers of the challenge will receive a medal and a free swim voucher for Sleaford Leisure Centre. Earrings

As we approach the summer holidays, we are aware that this is often a time when some parents/carers may decide for their children to have their ears pierced. We would strongly suggest that if this is a decision you are considering, that this takes place at the start of the summer holidays. This is due to the need to keep the first pair of earrings in for six weeks, the end of which will coincide with the commencement of the new school year. Under health and safety regulations for P.E. in schools, children are not allowed to take part in such activity if they are wearing earrings. Children must be able to remove these themselves before taking part in P.E. lessons – we are not permitted to tape earrings over. We thank you for your co-operation and understanding in this matter.

PTFA Summer Favre

The PTFA Summer Fayre will take place after school this evening, from 3:30pm on the school field. Please enter the field via the large green gates at the end of the car park. Toilets are available during the fayre, which can be accessed via the main entrance to the school. We hope to see as many of you as possible at this event.

Before and After School Supervision

There have been a couple of instances recently whereby children have had minor bumps and accidents in the car park whilst playing before and after school. Please can I remind everyone to take extra care before and after school and to ensure that children are fully supervised whilst on the premises at these times. Thank you very much for your cooperation.

Parking

I have this week received a letter from the Trustees to the Leasingham Village Hall. They have asked me to remind parents and carers that the Village Hall car park should only be used at school start and finish times, not at other times. This has caused a problem recently with Village Hall users being unable to access the car park. Whilst on the subject of parking, please can I again encourage all parents and carers to park safely when dropping off and collecting children from school. It is dangerous to park on the zig zag lines, which can make crossing the road particularly difficult with children and parents forced to step out between parked cars. When picking up or dropping off children at schools, you should do the following:

- Allow yourself plenty of time as the area is likely to be busy.
- Do not park on yellow zigzag lines and avoid parking opposite them.
- Please be considerate of local residents and avoid blocking driveways or accessways.

Local councils can issue motorists with penalty charge notices (PCN) for waiting, stopping, or parking on yellow zigzags if restrictions are in place.
