Dear Parent/Carer,

This is an update letter for events till the end of term and some reminders about keeping safe on the school site.

Wednesday 16th December

Christmas lunch for EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 with the chance to wear a Christmas jumper with school uniform. If children have PE that day, it will be uniform friendly so no PE kits. Please may I remind those who have not requested a hot dinner for their child a packed lunch from home will be required on that day. School will not be providing alternative food.

Thursday 17th December

Christmas lunch for Year 3,4,5 & 6 and a chance to wear a Christmas jumper with school uniform. If you have not ordered dinner, please remember pack lunch. Packed lunches will still be provided for Reception, Yr1 & 2 children on the Thursday (17th) for those currently receiving lunches from school.

The **17**^{th of} **December** will be the last day of the Autumn Term and the children will finish school at the usual time in the afternoon.
